# URBANA CITY COUNCIL MEETING MONDAY, NOVEMBER 4, 1996

The City Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois met in regular session at 7:30 p.m., Monday, November 4, 1996 in the Council Chambers of the Urbana City Building.
