1. Call to Order

Chair Kearns called the meeting to order at 7:32 p.m.

2. Additions to the Agenda and Staff Report

There were no additions to the agenda.

 Mayor Satterthwaite distributed a memo from Bill Gray (Public Works Director) regarding a grant application the City of Urbana was unsuccessful in obtaining--the Bicycle Path Grant Application for the multi-purpose path from Trails Drive to Colorado on Philo Road and a portion of Windsor Road. The City will be re-applying for this next Spring.

Mayor Satterthwaite also distributed a tentative timeline for the Flex-N-Gate project. The only real change is that Flex-N-Gate has requested final action for September 2, 1997 and an absolute last date of September 15, 1997. Public hearings have been scheduled and are ongoing.

Mr. Gray reported on some action staff would like to take based on a recent Traffic Commission meeting. The principal of Leal School and a parent approached the Commission regarding a safety concern on Oregon Street between Birch and Cedar Streets when children are being dropped-off and picked-up at school. There is not enough room for two-way traffic. The suggestion they had would be to make Oregon one-way westbound on that one block stretch. Staff would do this by posting barricades at the west end (Birch Street) between 8-8:20 a.m. and 2:45-3:05 p.m. A 90-day trial period is proposed, afterwhich time staff would report back to Council for any permanent action.

April Getchius (Community Development Director), Craig Grant (Building Safety Division Manager), William Pessemier (Fire Chief) and Jack Waaler (City Attorney) gave a report regarding The New Yorker Apartments. Mr. Grant reported on Building Code issues, to which he disagrees with BOCA's interpretation; Chief Pessemier reported on the issue of

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requirements because it is fully sprinklered; and Mr. Waaler addressed legal ramifications, pointing out that Mr. Grant, as the building official, is the legal person to make these determinations unless determined otherwise by a court of law.

3. Minutes of Previous Meeting

<u>July 28, 1997</u> -- Mr. Whelan made a motion to approve the minutes of July 28, 1997. Mr. Hayes seconded. The motion carried by voice vote.

4. Public Input

John L. Johnson, 309 S. State (Champaign), addressed the Committee in opposition to the ordinance regarding the appointment of Champaign County Housing Authority Commissioner.

Greg Springer, 206 Wood, representing the Downtown Neighborhood Association, addressed the Committee in support of the City's Comprehensive Plan revisions.

Earl O'Shea, 606-A Glover, addressed the Committee on the topic of "government as written in our laws", and expressed his support on the subject.

Allen Booth addressed the Committee on the topic of The New Yorker Apartments and his opposition to the way this issue was handled.

5. Greenscape Program Presentation

Michael Brunk (City Arborist) updated the Committee on the progress of the City of Urbana's Greenscape Program. Following the update, the Committee watched a video commercial organized by Mr. Brunk which promotes the Greenscape Program.

6. An Ordinance Regarding Appointment Of Champaign County Housing Authority Commissioner

Mr. Waaler presented the staff report.

Mr. Taylor made a motion to send this item to Council for approval. Mr. Whelan seconded. Following debate, the motion carried by voice vote.

7. Appointment To Champaign County Housing Authority

Assuming that the "Ordinance Regarding Appointment Of Champaign County Housing Authority Commissioner" is approved

by Council, Mayor Satterthwaite stated that he would be recommending Jeanette Donaldson to the Board. Ms Donaldson is a current member of the Board.

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Mr. Whelan made a motion to send this item to Council for approval and was seconded by Mr. Taylor.

 Ms Patt expressed concern about requesting Ms Donaldson to resign her seat on the Board in order to be reappointed as a resident of Urbana. Ms Patt states: "It's very hard to get behind the idea of giving up to the City of Champaign appointment powers that we fought for three years to win from the County. Since this comes to us in the form of a motion to appoint Jeanette Donaldson, I will support the motion. But I don't agree with this strategy and I wish the whole matter had been handled differently." Debate ensued.

Following debate, the motion to send this item to Council for approval carried by voice vote.

8. An Ordinance Revising The Annual Budget Ordinance (Telecommunications Consultant - \$7,000)

Bruce Walden (Chief Administrative Officer) presented the staff report to Committee.

Following debate, Mr. Taylor made a motion to send this item to Council for approval. Mr. Whelan seconded. The motion carried by voice vote.

9. An Ordinance Abandoning "Hickory Street Extended" As Public Right-Of-Way

Mr. Waaler presented the staff report.

Ms Patt made a motion to send this item to Council for approval. Mr. Whelan seconded. The motion carried by voice vote.

Adjournment

With no further business to come before the Committee, Chair Kearns adjourned the meeting at 9:35~p.m.
