Alderwoman Patt moved approval of the minutes of the October 18, 2004 regular meeting. The motion was seconded by Alderwoman Wyman and carried by a voice vote.

Mayor Satterthwaite read a Proclamation honoring Pat Stebbins, of the Housing Authority, for her volunteer contributions.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

Public Works Director Bill Gray presented staff report on Resolution No.

2004-11-022R: A Resolution Approving and Authorizing the Execution of an

Agreement Between the Illinois Department of Transportation and the City of

Urbana (Goodwin Avenue). This is an agreement to construct a bike path facility from the University of Illinois Campus to Bradley Avenue. The path shall be located on Goodwin Avenue from Springfield Avenue to Bradley Avenue.

Alderman Hayes moved to adopt Resolution No. 2004-11-022R: A

Resolution Approving and Authorizing the Execution of an Agreement Between

the Illinois Department of Transportation and the City of Urbana (Goodwin

Avenue). The motion was seconded by Alderwoman Wyman and carried by a voice vote.

City Attorney Steve Holz presented staff report on Ordinance No. 200411-139: A Revised Ordinance Authorizing the City Attorney to Request That the
U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Grant Exceptions for
Conflicts of Interest of Former Alderperson Laura Huth. Previously Mr. Holz had submitted an ordinance to Council that would have authorized him to seek a waiver from HUD for Laura Huth's conflict of interest. At that time, Ms. Huth requested that the waiver question be removed from the agenda and Council complied with her request.

Despite the intervening circumstances, a waiver from HUD is still needed. Mr. Holz reminded Ms. Huth of that in a letter dated October 12, 2004 and informed her that the issued would be before the Committee of the Whole on October 25, 2004. After receipt of that letter, Ms. Huth announced that she would resign her City Council position and requested that Mr. Holz delay bringing the ordinance to Council until November 1, 2004. Mr. Holz complied with the request.

Following debate, Alderwoman Wyman moved to approve <u>Ordinance No.</u>

2004-11-139: A Revised Ordinance Authorizing the City Attorney to Request That

the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Grant Exceptions for

Conflicts of Interest of Former Alderperson Laura Huth. The motion was seconded by Alderman Hayes and carried 4-0 by roll call vote. Voting aye were Members of the Council: Chynoweth, Hayes, Patt, and Wyman – 4; voting nay: none.

Mr. Gray presented staff report on Ordinance No. 2004-11-140: An Ordinance Granting a Permanent Easement (Ameren IP). Part of the work with the developers of the Stratford Residences involves how utilities will be rerouted in that area. This ordinance would grant a ten-foot wide easement to Ameren IP for an underground primary electric service.

Following debate, Alderwoman Wyman moved to approve <u>Ordinance No.</u>

2004-11-140: An Ordinance Granting a Permanent Easement (Ameren IP). The motion was seconded by Alderwoman Patt and carried 5-0 by roll call vote. Voting aye were Members of the Council: Chynoweth, Hayes, Patt, Wyman, and Mayor Satterthwaite – 5; voting nay: none.

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# **ADJOURNMENT**

There being no further business to come before the Council, Mayor Satterthwaite declared the meeting adjourned at 8:15 p.m.
