## **Urbana Police Department Memorandum**

**RE:** 2006 Traffic Stop Study Results and Analysis

Attached is the 2006 Illinois Traffic Stop Study report published by the Illinois Department of Transportation. As you might recall, Illinois law mandates that certain information be collected on all traffic stops by every law enforcement agency in the State of Illinois. This information is then transmitted to the Illinois Department of Transportation who then forwards it to Northwestern University for compilation and analysis.

The 2005 report is also attached for comparison purposes. You will notice that we made 960 more traffic stops in 2006 than we did in 2005. I believe that this can be attributed to the improvement in our available manpower in 2006. While making 960 additional traffic stops in 2006 our minority stop ratio increased from 1.44 in 2005 to 1.53 in 2006. This ratio is based on our "assigned" minority driving population. The Urbana Police 2006 data indicates that minorities are stopped at a rate higher than our assigned "estimated minority driving population" which according to Northwestern University is 30.62%. Our minority percentage of traffic stops in this report is 46.92%, which gives us the minority traffic stop ratio of 1.53. It is important to note that neither the law, nor Northwestern University has identified what the proper benchmark is as it pertains to minority stops. Each community has its own unique variables that must be considered.

During the past year, my command staff and I have spent a significant amount of time analyzing the numbers contained in this report. We do not believe that Urbana Police Officers are stopping vehicles solely based on the race of the driver. We have taken many additional steps to ensure this does not occur in Urbana. Statistical information can be misleading. Many communities are challenging the assigned number that designates the "estimated minority driving population". This is a time consuming and expensive proposition. I believe our time, effort and money are better spent taking the necessary steps to ensure that racial profiling is not occurring within our department. Champaign has recently challenged their assigned minority driving population number and was successful in gaining a favorable adjustment.

The sole goal and purpose of this study should not be to attempt to make the minority stop ratio a perfect "1". I believe this would be manipulating the numbers at the expense of the citizens we attempt to serve.

Contained in this report is not only the information required by state law, but additional breakdowns of related information concerning the 4015 traffic stops from 2006. I believe this information is helpful to get a more accurate picture of the information provided in the one page state report. The breakdowns denoted in the tables provide a look at not only racial demographics, but also includes age, location, times and dispositions of the stops. Additionally, calls for service are included as well as the various demographic information surrounding those calls.

We continue to believe there is a strong correlation between the calls for service and the areas that show the higher numbers of traffic stops. Traffic stops are a component of an overall approach to dealing with criminal problems in any given location.

Our Strategic Traffic Enforcement Program (STEP) has an impact on our overall traffic stop numbers. Of the 4015 total traffic stops, 1126 were made as a direct result of the officers working STEP. STEP

locations are assigned based largely on complaints or requests from citizens or in areas of high traffic accident locations.

During last year's discussion of this topic it became apparent that a zip code analysis of those stopped would be helpful. New in this year's report is the zip code breakdown of the drivers for all 4015 traffic stops. It is certainly noteworthy that of the 4015 traffic stops 53% listed an Urbana zip code as their residence while 43% lived outside of the city.

To further put the 2006 Urbana Traffic Stop Study report into context, I have reviewed other central Illinois police department's Traffic Stop reports. That information is listed below.

Statistical numbers can be interpreted to mean different things to different people. There are many variables associated with this study and determining the true meaning of the numbers makes it difficult for everyone to agree.

Anti-bias based policing remains an important oversight responsibility of the command staff at the Urbana Police Department. This is a responsibility that we take quite seriously. We must remain responsive to the community that we serve. I want to be clear that racial profiling will not be tolerated at the Urbana Police Department. We will continue to take the appropriate steps to make sure that traffic stops are being made because of behavior and not race.

#### Those steps include:

- The Urbana Police Directive which prohibits racial profiling will continue to be the subject of training during our department wide training sessions. This directive, and issues surrounding it, will continue to be included in any new officer training.
- Individual Officer's traffic stop numbers and related demographics associated with those traffic stops will continue to be monitored on a regular basis by the Officer's immediate supervisors as well as the Patrol Commander.
- We have just finished with the installation of a quality digital video system in all of our marked squad cars. This will greatly improve the ability of our supervisors to conduct random evaluations of officer's traffic stops.

- The entire department will undergo diversity training in the Fall of 2007.
- We will continue to actively investigate all allegations of racial profiling brought to our attention.
- The contents of this report will be discussed during shift briefings so that all Urbana Police
  Officers who are engaged in making traffic stops are fully aware of the collective numbers.
- While we continue to encourage anyone who believes they have been the victim of racial
  profiling to contact my office, the pending Civilian Police Review Board should provide another
  avenue to express this concern.

I intend to have discussion with those responsible for the data analysis at Northwestern University over the possible inaccuracy of our assigned minority driving population. The issues that I believe may impact the accuracy of our assigned driving population include:

- Community Development reports that Urbana housing stock is 63% rental (37% owner occupied) compared to Champaign which has 54% rental (46% owner occupied) and finally the state average of 37% rental (63% owner occupied). It is a reasonable assumption that rental property provides a more transient population over a longer period of time, than would owner occupied housing. Therefore, the number assigned by Northwestern University for the Urbana minority driving population is likely to be more uncertain than other jurisdictions due to the relatively high number of rental properties.
- Zip Code data indicates that only 53% of those stopped are Urbana residents.
- Champaign had their estimated driving population adjusted upward by 5.4% for 2006.
- High School population data indicates a shift in Urbana demographics since 2000.
