INTRODUCTION

After the April 19, 1996 tornado that struck Urbana, we received a FEMA grant to cover our emergency response and cleanup costs. We also received funding to upgrade our entire emergency warning (sirens) system which included the installation of a local AM radio station that could be used to broadcast emergency and non-emergency messages with coverage throughout Urbana and most of Champaign (ten-mile radius coverage). This station currently broadcasts NOAA weather reports. In an effort to expand this radio station's capabilities during non-emergency events, staff believes it is desirable to broadcast community/tourism information.

The Illinois Department of Transportation will install, on eastbound and westbound I-74, signs informing motorists to tune to AM 530 for local weather and community/tourism information. The Illinois Department of Transportation requires, prior to installation, two resolutions: one that indicates tourism information and the other indicates emergency broadcast information, both on AM 530.

The Urbana Business Association is very supportive of this effort as it is in keeping with its mission to promote Urbana.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the attached two resolutions be approved.

APPENDIX 7.AA

AGREEMENT

(Typical)

This Agreement is entered into between the State of Illinois, acting through its Department of Transportation, hereinafter referred to as the STATE and the <u>City of Urbana</u>, hereinafter referred to as the (<u>CITY</u>).

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the (<u>CITY</u>)_desires to operate a Tourist Information Radio Station designed to serve motorists traveling along <u>Interstate</u> 74, between mile stations______ and_____; (or other <u>appropriate</u> location description) West of exit 183 and East of exit 185 and North of 2500N on RT 45 WHEREAS, the (<u>CITY</u>)_has applied for and obtained a station on a frequency of (530 kHz) under 47CRF Ch. 1, Pars. 90.17 and 90.242, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit 1;

WHEREAS, the $(\underline{CITY})_{will}$ install said station at the location shown on Exhibit 1; and

WHEREAS, the (<u>CITY</u>)_desires to have official highway signs installed by the STATE informing motorists of said stations.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and mutual covenants contained herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1) The STATE shall erect and maintain at its expense, signs

along <u>174 & RT 45</u> advising motorists of said station. When such signs are installed, information concerning the station will not be installed on other directional or information signs.

- The (<u>CITY</u>)_shall pass a resolution indicating its intent to operate at its expense said station 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, except for periods of maintenance in accordance with applicable FCC regulations. -
- 3) The (CITY) shall also, by resolution, allow the STATE, at no expense, to insert information over said station in the event of an emergency or when necessary because of major highway construction in the area.

This AGREEMENT shall remain in effect for (1) a period of (twenty years) from the date of its execution, or (2) so long as said station remains in operation in conformance with applicable FCC regulations, whichever of (1) or (2) is the shorter period of time unless otherwise agreed to in writing by the parties hereto.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the STATE and the (CITY) hereto have caused this AGREEMENT to be made, effective and executed by their respective duly authorized officials.
