NEW BUSINESS

Planner Michaela Bell presented staff report on Ordinance No. 2003-03-018: An

Ordinance Approving a Major Variance (Request to Increase the Maximum Area of a Freestanding

Sign from 50 Sq. Ft. to 66 Sq. Ft. in the B-3, General Business District – 1509 East Washington

<u>Street, Case No. ZBA-03-MAJ-01</u>). Adam Judeh requests a variance to add a 26 square foot illuminated sign to an existing freestanding sign at 1509 East Washington Street. The request is to increase the maximum sign area from 50 square feet to 66 square feet by adding a gasoline price sign. This request is classified as a major variance and requires City Council approval. The Zoning Board of Appeals voted 6-0 to forward this request to Council for approval and staff concurs.

Following debate, Alderwoman Chynoweth moved to approve <u>Ordinance No. 2003-03-</u> <u>018: An Ordinance Approving a Major Variance (Request to Increase the Maximum Area of a</u> <u>Freestanding Sign from 50 Sq. Ft. to 66 Sq. Ft. in the B-3, General Business District – 1509 East</u> <u>Washington Street, Case No. ZBA-03-MAJ-01</u>). The motion was seconded by Alderwoman Patt and carried 7-0 by roll call vote. Voting aye were Members of the Council: Chynoweth, Hayes, Huth, Otto, Patt, Whelan, and Wyman – 7; voting nay: none.

Community Development Director Libby Tyler presented staff report on <u>Ordinance No.</u> 2003-03-019: An Ordinance Amending the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Urbana, Illinois

(Regarding Nonconformities Created Through Government Acquisition – Plan Case No. 1850-T-03).

The Zoning Administrator is requesting an amendment to the Zoning Ordinance to allow recognition of and more flexible regulation of nonconformities that are created or exacerbated through government acquisition or under threat of government acquisition. The proposed amendment would provide for administrative approval of the relocation of such uses, buildings or structures to adjoining locations under certain conditions. The Plan Commission unanimously recommended approval of the proposed recommendation and staff concurs.

Following debate, Alderwoman Wyman moved to approve <u>Ordinance No. 2003-03-019:</u> <u>An Ordinance Amending the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Urbana, Illinois (Regarding</u> <u>Nonconformities Created Through Government Acquisition – Plan Case No. 1850-T-03</u>). The motion was seconded by Alderwoman Chynoweth and carried 7-0 by roll call vote. Voting aye were Members of the Council: Chynoweth, Hayes, Huth, Otto, Patt, Whelan, and Wyman – 7; voting nay: none.

Alderwoman Wyman moved enter into <u>Closed Session</u> for the purpose of considering <u>Appointment, Employment and Compensation of Specific Employees of the City</u>. The motion was seconded by Alderwoman Patt and carried 7-0 by roll call vote. Voting aye were Members of the Council: Urbana City Council March 3, 2003 Page 4

Chynoweth, Hayes, Huth, Otto, Patt, Whelan, and Wyman – 7; voting nay: none. Council entered into
