## URBANA CITY COUNCIL MEETING September 7, 2004

The City Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois met in regular session at 7:30 p.m., Tuesday, September 7, 2004 in the Urbana City Council Chambers at 400 South Vine Street.

There being a quorum, Mayor Satterthwaite called the meeting to order at 7:32 p.m.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited in honor of Labor Day.

### **MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING**

Alderwoman Wyman moved approval of the minutes of the August 16, 2004 regular meeting. The motion was seconded by Alderwoman Patt and carried by a voice vote.

Mayor Satterthwaite requested that Ordinance No. 2004-09-119: An Ordinance

Approving a Development Agreement with Stratford Center, LLC, #6 under NEW BUSINESS be

moved to be the first item of discussion due to the number of people present interested in the item. There

#### PETITIONS AND COMMUNICATIONS

Christopher Alex, 301 East George Huff, addressed the Council to state his appreciation for the way it has handled the M.O.R. recommendations.

Alderman Hayes announced that he would not seek re-election for his seat as Alderman for Ward 3 in the next election.

Mayor Satterthwaite thanked Alderman Hayes for his twelve years of service to City of the Urbana.

voting nay: Otto – 1.

Alderwoman Patt moved to approve Ordinance No. 2004-05-053: An Ordinance

Regarding City Officials and Employee Ethics and Political Activity. The motion was seconded by Alderwoman Wyman.

Following debate, Alderman Otto moved to amend the main motion to add to Section 2-207 in the second sentence after the word officer, the phrase "or to any relative, as the term relative is described in Section 2-205, paragraph 6." Following debate, the motion failed for lack of a second.

Following further debate, Mayor Pro Tem Hayes took the Chair and Mayor Satterthwaite entered debate. Following debate, Mayor Satterthwaite resumed the Chair.

(Encroachment at east edge of 300 W. Main). The motion was seconded by Alderwoman Patt and carried 5-0 by roll call vote. Voting aye were Members of the Council: Chynoweth, Hayes, Otto, Patt, and Wyman – 5; voting nay: none.

### REPORTS OF OFFICERS

Chief Administrative Officer Bruce Walden presented the **Economic Development Update.** Council Members have the report before them. Staff has been spending a considerable amount of time on some of the issues in Southeast Urbana; Sunnycrest and Philo trying to come up with strategies.

# NEW BUSINESS

Planning Division Manager Rob Kowalski presented staff report on Ordinance No. 2004-09-115: An Ordinance Approving a Final Subdivision Plat (Savannah Green Subdivision Phase VII-Plan Case No. 1905-S-04). Construx of Illinois has submitted a final plat for Phase VII of the Savannah Green Subdivision. The plat would create 27 lots to the west of Phase VI, which is currently under construction. The plat would dedicate the continuation of Smith Road, Rainbow View Drive and Country Squire Drive from their existing stubs. Staff recommends approval.

Alderwoman Patt moved to approve <u>Ordinance No. 2004-09-115</u>: <u>An Ordinance</u>

Approving a Final Subdivision Plat (Savannah Green Subdivision Phase VII– Plan Case No. 1905-S-

**04)**. The motion was seconded by Alderwoman Wyman and carried 5-0 by roll call vote. Voting aye were Members of the Council: Chynoweth, Hayes, Otto, Patt, and Wyman – 5; voting nay: none.

Mr. Kowalski presented staff report on <u>Ordinance No. 2004-09-116: An Ordinance</u>

<u>Approving an Extension of Final Plat Approval (Walton Subdivision No. 1 – Plan Case No. 1884-S-04)</u>.

Alderman Otto recused himself due to a possible conflict of interest.

Mr. Kowalski stated that although the final plat has been approved and is ready to be recorded, unforeseen legal circumstances associated with the real estate closing on the property, have caused a hold up. The plat has not been recorded and the property has not been transferred. Due to this, the project engineer has requested a 180-day extension of the final plat approval. Staff recommends approval.

Following debate, Alderwoman Wyman moved to approve Ordinance No. 2004-09-116:

Planner Paul Lindahl presented staff report on Ordinance No. 2004-09-117: An

Ordinance Approving a Major Variance (To Allow an Increase in the Maximum Permitted Floor Area

Ratio from 0.40 to 0.45 at 510 W. Washington Avenue in Urbana's R-2, Single-Family Residential

Zoning District / Case No. ZBA-04-MAJ-11). Laura Green has requested an increase in the maximum allowable Floor Area Ratio (FAR) to accommodate a proposed addition to her home and garage. Staff recommends approval.

Alderwoman Patt moved to approve <u>Ordinance No. 2004-09-117: An Ordinance</u>

Approving a Major Variance (To Allow an Increase in the Maximum Permitted Floor Area Ratio from

0.40 to 0.45 at 510 W. Washington Avenue in Urbana's R-2, Single-Family Residential Zoning District

/ Case No. ZBA-04-MAJ-11). The motion was seconded by Alderman Otto.

Mayor Satterthwaite declared a five-minute recess at 9:15 p.m. The Council reconvened at 9:26 p.m. with all members previously in attendance still present.

Mr. Whelan arrived at 9:26 p.m.

Mayor Satterthwaite stated that the motion on the floor was to approve <u>Ordinance No.</u>

2004-09-117: An Ordinance Approving a Major Variance (To Allow an Increase in the Maximum

Permitted Floor Area Ratio from 0.40 to 0.45 at 510 W. Washington Avenue in Urbana's R-2, Single
Family Residential Zoning District / Case No. ZBA-04-MAJ-11). The motion carried 6-0 by roll call vote. Voting aye were Members of the Council: Chynoweth, Hayes, Otto, Patt, Whelan, and Wyman – 6; voting nay: none.

Alderman Whelan moved to reconsider Ordinance No. 2004-09-116: An Ordinance

Approving an Extension of Final Plat Approval (Walton Subdivision No. 1 – Plan Case No. 1884-S
04). The motion was seconded by Alderwoman Patt. Alderman Otto recused himself due to a conflict of interest. The motion to reconsider carried by a voice vote.

Alderwoman Wyman moved to approve <u>Ordinance No. 2004-09-116</u>: <u>An Ordinance</u>

<u>Approving an Extension of Final Plat Approval (Walton Subdivision No. 1 – Plan Case No. 1884-S-04)</u>. The motion was seconded by Alderwoman Patt.

Following debate, the motion carried by 4-1 by roll call vote. Voting aye were Members of the Council: Hayes, Patt, Whelan, and Wyman – 4; voting nay: Chynoweth – 1.

Mr. Lindahl presented staff report on <u>Ordinance No. 2004-09-118: An Ordinance</u>

<u>Approving a Major Variance (To Allow a 100% Increase in the Maximum Permitted Letter Size From</u>

6" to 12" for an Identification Sign at the North West Corner of 101 W. Windsor Road in the R-3,

Single- and Two-Family Residential Zoning District / Case No. ZBA-04-MAJ-09) and Ordinance No. 2004-09-120: An Ordinance Approving a Major Variance (To Allow a 100% Increase in the Maximum Permitted Letter Size From 6" to 12" for an Identification Sign at the Main North Entrance of 101 W. Windsor Road in the R-3, Single- and Two-Family Residential Zoning District / Case No. ZBA-04-MAJ-10). These two variances were filed by Clark-Lindsey Village for a proposed change in the identification signage for their facility. The petitioners would like to construct a new brick gateway wall at their entrance on Windsor Road. These variances would allow an increase in the permitted letter size of the words "Clark-Lindsey Village." Staff concurs with the ZBA recommendation of approval.

Approving a Major Variance (To Allow a 100% Increase in the Maximum Permitted Letter Size From 6" to 12" for an Identification Sign at the North West Corner of 101 W. Windsor Road in the R-3,

Single- and Two-Family Residential Zoning District / Case No. ZBA-04-MAJ-09). The motion was seconded by Alderwoman Wyman. Following debate, the motion carried 6-0 by roll call vote. Voting aye were Members of the Council: Chynoweth, Hayes, Otto, Patt, Whelan, and Wyman – 6; voting nay: none.

Approving a Major Variance (To Allow a 100% Increase in the Maximum Permitted Letter Size From 6" to 12" for an Identification Sign at the Main North Entrance of 101 W. Windsor Road in the R-3, Single- and Two-Family Residential Zoning District / Case No. ZBA-04-MAJ-10). The motion was seconded by Alderwoman Wyman and carried 6-0 by roll call vote. Voting aye were Members of the Council: Chynoweth, Hayes, Otto, Patt, Whelan, and Wyman – 6; voting nay: none.

Mayor Satterthwaite presented Betsy Cronan, 305 West High Street, as the final <u>Mayoral</u> <u>Appointment for the Development Review Board</u>. Ms. Cronan is the owner and manager of a small pottery studio on Griggs Street. The term will expire June 30, 2007. Alderman Hayes moved approval of

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Betsy Cronan to the Development Review Board. The motion was seconded by Alderwoman Patt and

carried by a voice vote.

City Attorney Steve Holz introduced the representatives who will make a **Presentation by** 

Illinois American Water Company, Sue Schultz, Attorney for Illinois American Water; Terry Gloriod,

Managing Director for the Central Region and President of Illinois American Water Company; Fred

Ruckman, General Manager for the State of Illinois; and Brent O'Neill, District Manager for the Champaign-

Urbana District.

Mr. Gloriod presented an overview of the reorganization of the company and what is going

on with the operations of Illinois American Water Company. Mr. Gloriod expressed the commitment of the

company to maintain good service to Urbana.

Following Mr. Glorio's presentation, the group of representatives from Illinois American

Water Company answered questions from City Council Members.
