AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 1-18 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES
(PAY-BY-MAIL SCHEDULE CLEANUP: ANIMAL ORDINANCE, GARBAGE
CONTAINERS REQUIRED, TAXICAB ORDINANCE)

WHEREAS, the Pay-by-mail schedule in Section 1-18 of the Code of Ordinances contains some errors and omits some changes that are required to keep it current with recent amendments to the code of ordinances;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1. That Section 1-18 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Urbana is amended, to read as set forth in the attached table which is incorporated by reference into this ordinance.

Section 2. The City Clerk is directed to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form by authority of the corporate authorities, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication in accordance with Section 1-2-4 of the Illinois Municipal Code.
