RE: 2007 Boneyard Creek Community Day

This purpose of this report is to inform the City Council of the 2nd annual Boneyard Creek Community Day which is scheduled for April 21, 2007. Hundreds of volunteers from Urbana, Champaign, and the University of Illinois will be clad in orange tee-shirts and deployed from Scott Park in Champaign to initiate the restoration and clean-up of the Boneyard Creek. The event will offer a wide variety of volunteer opportunities. Volunteer groups will help remove invasive, non-native plants from sections of the stream's corridor and replace them with native plants. Other groups will be cleaning up streamside trash and marking storm sewer inlets with medallions that say, "Dump No Waste – Drains to Creek," to inform Urbana-Champaign residents that all trash, soil, and yard waste that enters the storm sewer inlets does not get treated but runs directly to the Boneyard Creek.

Sponsors for the 2006 Boneyard Creek Community Day included the City of Urbana, City of Champaign, the University of Illinois, Urbana and Champaign area Rotary clubs, Urbana Middle School, Urbana Park District, Champaign Park District, and the Prairie Rivers Network. Urbana contributed tee-shirts, storm sewer inlet medallion kits, and trash pick-up kits for the event.

Over two hundred volunteers participated in the 2006 event and an even larger turn-out is anticipated for this year. Attached are photos of the volunteer's efforts taken during the 2006 Boneyard Creek Community Day.
