SUBJECT: AN ORDINANCE APPROVING MODIFICATIONS TO THE CITY OF

URBANA AND URBANA/CHAMPAIGN/CHAMPAIGN COUNTY HOME

CONSORTIUM FY 2007-2008 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN

Description

Included on the agenda of the July 14, 2008 meeting of the Urbana City Council is an ordinance approving an amendment to the City of Urbana and Urbana HOME Consortium Annual Action Plan for Fiscal Year 2007-2008. The proposed amendment allocates unobligated City of Urbana HOME Program carryover funds and program income to be utilized for the redevelopment of Lakeside Terrace, now known as Crystal View Townhomes. The proposed amendment also reduces the scope of the Developmental Services Center expansion project from constructing additional space to roof repair of the existing facility only.

Issue

The issue is whether the Urbana City Council should approve the ordinance approving modifications to the City of Urbana and Urbana HOME Consortium FY 2007-2008 Annual Action Plan.

Background

The City of Urbana FY 2007-2008 Annual Action Plan (FY 07/08 AAP) includes funds budgeted for two projects included in the proposed amendment, (1) the redevelopment of Lakeside Terrace (Crystal View Townhomes); and (2) the expansion of the Developmental Services Center (DSC) facility located on Clark Road in Champaign. Following is an explanation of each of the proposed amendments:

(1) **Crystal View Townhomes Amendment (HOME).** The City of Urbana has allocated funding in previous Annual Action Plans for the Crystal View Townhomes project. In March 2008, the developer of the project, Brinshore Development, received notification from the Illinois Housing Development Authority that its application for allocation of low-income housing tax credits to the Crystal View Townhomes was approved. However, due to current market conditions and increasing construction costs, there is a

need for more funding than originally indicated in the project budget included with the tax credit application.

Because this project is a critical element of the City's affordable housing needs, staff worked to identify additional available HOME Program funding that could be made available to the project. The proposed amendment allocates up to \$101,843 in additional HOME funds to the project. Local match funding of \$25,254 for the project will provided in the form of waived City of Urbana permit fees. These fees were waived by the City as a part of the application to the Illinois Housing Development Authority (IHDA) for Low Income Housing Tax Credits in order to achieve additional points toward a successful application.

(2) **DSC Amendment (CDBG).** The Developmental Services Center (DSC) project originally requested funding for the proposed construction of an addition to the DSC's Clark Road facility. Part of that work included the repair of the roof of the existing building. The intent of the project was to expand the available space and relocate some of DSC's operations from its Bradley Avenue facility in order to consolidate vocational training onto one site. Because the funding from other grants sources that was anticipated for the expansion project is not currently available, and due to the uncertainty of future funding, DSC has requested that the project scope be reduced to include only the roof repair project. DSC indicates that when funding becomes available in the future, they will, "reassess the project scope and move forward."

The proposed amendment reduces the scope of the project to repair the roof of the existing facility only. The roof repair was included in the original project and needs to be completed whether or not the expansion project was undertaken.

At its July 1, 2008 meeting, the Urbana Community Development Commission voted unanimously to forward the amendment to the Urbana City Council with a recommendation for approval.

Options

- 1. Approve the ordinance approving modifications to the City of Urbana and Urbana/ Champaign/Champaign County Home Consortium FY 2007-2008 Annual Action Plan.
- 2. Approve the ordinance approving the amendment with changes.
- 3. Do not approve the ordinance.

Fiscal Impacts

There will be no fiscal impact to the city budget. The HOME funds for this amendment are available from previous year's program income and remaining balances from various completed projects.

The City has previously pledged financial support for the Crystal View Townhomes project at a level of \$200,000. In the FY 2006-2007 Annual Action Plan, the City allocated \$100,000 (\$50,000 CDBG and \$50,000 HOME and Local Match) to the project. The FY 2007-2008 Annual Action Plan allocated an additional \$100,000 (\$50,000 CDBG and \$50,000 HOME and Match) to the project. As noted above, the City has previously agreed to waive building permit fees for the project, which is a value equivalent to \$75,000. This reduction is consistent with an established policy, which allows for a case-by-case reduction in permit fees for other governmental units, including the Housing Authority. The value of the waived permit fees will be utilized as credit toward the required local matching funds for the project.

Recommendations

The Urbana Community Development Commission and staff recommend that the Urbana City Council approve the ordinance approving the amendment to the City of Urbana and Urbana HOME Consortium FY 2007-2008 Annual Action Plan.

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING MODIFICATIONS TO THE CITY OF URBANA AND URBANA/CHAMPAIGN/CHAMPAIGN COUNTY HOME CONSORTIUM FY 2007-2008 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN

WHEREAS, the City of Urbana has been designated an entitlement city under the Federal Housing and Community Development act of 1974, as amended, and as such is eligible for Community Development Block (hereinafter "CDBG") and Home Investment Partnership Funds (hereinafter "HOME") funds upon proper submittal being made to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (hereinafter "HUD"); and

WHEREAS, the Urbana City Council previously approved an ordinance authorizing submittal to HUD of the Annual Action Plan for FY 2007-2008, that included proposed budgets for the CDBG and HOME Programs and HUD subsequently approved the said Annual Action Plan; and

WHEREAS, on June 13, 2008 the City of Urbana published on the City website a notice of a 30-day public review period regarding said proposed budgetary amendments to the Annual Action Plan for FY 2007-2008; and

WHEREAS, on June 20, 2008 the City of Urbana published in the Champaign-Urbana News-Gazette a 14-day notice of a public hearing regarding said proposed budgetary amendments to the Annual Action Plan for FY 2007-2008; and

WHEREAS, on July 8, 2008 the Grants Management Division of the City of Urbana held a public hearing on the proposed amendments; and

WHEREAS, the City Council now finds it necessary and appropriate to amend the City of Urbana and Champaign/Urbana/Champaign County HOME Consortium Annual Action Plan for FY 2007-2008.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1. That the City of Urbana, as lead entity for the Urbana HOME Consortium, hereby approves the amendment to the City of Urbana and Champaign/Urbana/Champaign County HOME Consortium Annual Action Plan FY 2007-2008, as such amendment is referenced in the attachment hereto.

Section 2. That the Mayor of the City of Urbana is hereby designated as the authorized representative of the City of Urbana to take any action necessary in conjunction with said attached amendment to the Annual Action Plan FY 2007-2008 and any prior approved Annual Action Plan or Amendment, including, without limitations, to execute any documents necessary to commit applicable HOME funds to the project for redevelopment of Lakeside Terrace now known as Crystal View Townhomes, submittal of the Annual Action Plan Amendment to the HUD-Regional Field Office and provision of such additional information as may be required.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO CITY OF URBANA and URBANA HOME CONSORTIUM FY 2007-2008 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN

CITY OF URBANA – FY 2007-2008 HOME

The City of Urbana proposes to re-allocate up to \$101,843 in unexpended federal HOME funding and \$25,454 in local match funding remaining from unobligated carryover grant funds (cumulative from various projects).

<u>Crystal View Townhomes</u> Funds will be reserved for the redevelopment of affordable rental housing units at the Crystal View Townhomes (*former site of Lakeside Terrace public housing*). The project must be consistent with affordable housing goals as outlined in the 2005-2009 Consolidated Plan, the 2005 Comprehensive Plan, and the 2004 Lakeside Redevelopment Plan, and must comply with applicable local, state and federal regulations.

CITY OF URBANA CDBG FY 2007-2008 PROPOSED AMENDMENT:

1. <u>Developmental Services Center (FY 07-08)</u> Funds will be used to expand repair the roof of DSC's Clark Road vocational training site. The Developmental Services Center enhances the lives of individuals with developmental disabilities by providing services and support that enable them to live, work, learn, and participate in their communities.

This amendment proposes to reduce the overall scope of the project due to inability of subgrantee to secure other funding.
