SUBJECT: Consideration of an Ordinance Amending Section 1-18 of the Urbana City Code

(minimum fine schedule for certain violations)

Introduction

This proposed ordinance increases the fines for most offenses listed in the minimum fine schedule for certain violations.

Background

Section 1-18 of the Urbana City Code contains a list of minimum fines for certain ordinance violations. Persons accused of violating the ordinances set forth in Section 1-18 may be permitted to pay the minimum fine as settlement of the violation before a complaint is filed in court. Most of these minimum fines have remained unchanged since 2004 (Ordinance No. 2004-03-026). The proposed ordinance increases many of these fines. This ordinance also makes minor changes to some descriptions of violations to promote greater clarity.

A table comparing proposed City of Urbana minimum fines with those currently in effect for City of Champaign ordinance violations is attached to this memorandum.

Fiscal Impact

Approval of the proposed ordinance will help to offset the higher costs of providing municipal services associated with these violations. Non-approval will limit the City's ability to offset these costs or to offer a deterrent to the commission of the violations contained in the schedule.

Recommendation

Approve the ordinance amending Section 1-18 of the Urbana City Code.

ORDINANCE	NO.	

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 1-18 OF THE URBANA CITY CODE (minimum fine schedule for certain violations)

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the City Council heretofore have adopted Section 1-18 of the Urbana City Code establishing minimum fines for violations of certain sections of the Urbana City Code; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the City Council find that the best interests of the City are served by amending said section.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Urbana, Champaign County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1.

Urbana City Code Chapter 1, "General Provisions," Section 1-18, "Minimum fine schedule for certain violations," is hereby amended as set forth in Exhibit "A," which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, with the underlined text indicating new language and the strikethrough text indicating deletions.

Section 2.

Those sections, paragraphs, and provisions of the Urbana City Code that are not expressly amended or repealed by this Ordinance are hereby re-enacted, and it is expressly declared to be the intention of this Ordinance not to repeal or amend any portions of the Urbana City Code other than those expressly set forth as amended or repealed in this Ordinance. The invalidity of any section or provision of this Ordinance hereby passed and approved shall not invalidate other sections or provisions thereof.

Section 3.

This Ordinance shall not be construed to affect any suit or proceeding pending in any court, or any rights acquired, or a liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing prior to the effective date of this Ordinance; nor shall any right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired, or

affected by this Ordinance.

Section 4.

The City Clerk is directed to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form by authority of the corporate authorities, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.

This Ordinance is hereby passed by the affirmative vote, the "ayes" and "nays" being called, of a majority of the members of the Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, at a meeting of said Council.
