RE: Property Tax Levy

Attached for your consideration is the City's 2009 property tax levy ordinances and resolution. These documents must be filed with the County Clerk no later than the 2^{nd} Tuesday in December.

The attached levy ordinance and resolution have been prepared in order to maintain the same levy rate of 1.2942 (same as Champaign). Some additional important points concerning the property tax levy are:

- This levy would mean a homeowner would pay on average 2.5% more than last year (an additional \$19 on a \$175,000 home). This 2.5% represents the average increase in the value of current homes. Last year's levy rate was the same \$1.29 and average homeowners paid additional 2.2% to City of Urbana.
- This levy will also capture property tax on new development. It is highly appropriate to capture this increase since additional costs and service demands are placed on Urbana from this new development.
- Since 1999, the City has reduced the rate from \$1.47 to \$1.29. This has saved the owner of the \$175,000 home \$1,025 in taxes paid to the City over this 10 year period.
- Urbana's tax rate of \$1.29 is approximately in the middle of tax rates of other central Illinois cities (Normal \$1.17, Decatur \$1.23, Bloomington \$1.27, Champaign \$1.29, Rantoul \$1.66, and Danville \$1.78).
- The City's ability to affect the total amount of property taxes a homeowner pays is limited in that the City only accounts for 15% of the total property tax bill (School District is 53%).

- Over the last 10 years, the overall tax rate paid by Urbana homeowners has decreased from \$9.10 to \$8.22. This has saved the owner of the \$175,000 home \$5,133 in total taxes paid during this time. This reduction has been accomplished even as taxpayers have approved 6 referendums during this time: 1995 for new jail, 1997 for countywide public health district, 2002 for bonds and operating costs for nursing home, and 2004 for development disabilities board).
- Due to significantly lower sales and income taxes, the City of Urbana is projecting an operating deficit of \$1.3 million dollars for FY09-10 and an additional \$1 million deficit (without any employee salary adjustments) for next budget year.

ORDINANCE NO. 2009-11-117

ANNUAL TAX LEVY ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS FOR THE YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2009 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2010

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities of the City of Urbana, Illinois, pursuant to an ordinance previously adopted authorizing the same, did, on the 1st day of June, 2009, that date being before the beginning of the fiscal year of the city commencing on July 1, 2009, and ending on June 30, 2010, adopt the Annual Budget Ordinance for the city for such fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Sections 8-2-9.1 <u>et seq</u>. of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/8-2-9.1 <u>et seq</u>.) and home rule ordinances previously adopted authorizing the same (Code of Ordinances, City of Urbana, Illinois, Sections 2-113 and 2-132), such passage of the Annual Budget Ordinance by the Corporate Authorities shall be in lieu of passage of the Annual Appropriation Ordinance otherwise required by the Illinois Municipal Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CORPORATE AUTHORITIES OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS, as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. That the total maximum amount of appropriations for all corporate purposes, which are legally made to be collected from the tax levy of the current fiscal year of the City of Urbana, is hereby ascertained to be the sum of Eight Million, Seventy Thousand Six Hundred Fifty Six Dollars (\$8,070,656).

<u>Section 2</u>. That the sum of \$8,070,656 being the total of budgeted appropriations heretofore legally made which are to be collected from the tax levy of the current fiscal year of the City of Urbana, Illinois, for all corporate purposes of said City of Urbana, Illinois, is hereby levied upon all of the taxable property in the City of Urbana, Illinois, subject to taxation for the current year; provided that the levy of such amounts does not cause the property tax rate to exceed 1.2942. If the levy amount of \$8,070,656 produces a tax rate higher than 1.2942, then the amount to be levied and collected for general corporate purposes shall be reduced to an amount which produces the 1.2942 total rate for all corporate purposes.

The specific amounts as levied for the various funds heretofore named are separately included herein by being placed in separate columns under the heading "To Be Raised by Tax Levy" which appears over the same, the tax so levied being for the current fiscal year of the City of Urbana and for the said budgeted appropriation to be collected from said tax levy, the total of which has been ascertained as aforesaid and being as follows:

<u>Section 3</u>. This Annual Tax Levy Ordinance is adopted pursuant to the procedures set forth in the Illinois Municipal Code; provided, however, that any tax rate limitation or any other substantive limitations as to tax levies in the Illinois Municipal

Code in conflict with this ordinance shall not be applicable to this ordinance pursuant to Section 6 of Article VII of the Constitution of the State of Illinois.

Section 4. That there is hereby certified to the County Clerk of Champaign County, Illinois, the several sums aforesaid, constituting said total amount of Eight Million, Seventy Thousand Six Hundred Fifty Six Dollars (\$8,070,656) which said total amount the City of Urbana requires to be raised by taxation for the current fiscal year of the City, provided that the levy of such amounts does not cause the property tax rate to exceed 1.2942. If the levy amount of \$8,070,656 produces a tax rate higher than 1.2942, then the amount to be levied and collected for general corporate purposes shall be reduced to an amount which produces the 1.2942 total rate for all corporate purposes. The City Clerk of the City of Urbana is hereby ordered and directed to file with the County Clerk of Champaign County on or before the time required by law, a certified copy of this ordinance.

 $\underline{\text{Section 5}}$. If any provisions of this ordinance or the application of such provisions to any circumstances is held invalid for any reason whatsoever, the remainder of this ordinance or the application of the provisions to other circumstances shall not be affected hereby.

<u>Section 6</u>. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect immediately on and after its passage and approval.

This ordinance is hereby passed by the affirmative vote, the "ayes" and "nays" being called, of a majority of the corporate authorities of the City of Urbana, Illinois, at a regular meeting of said authorities.
