THINK URBANA:

Staff have presented to multiple Realtors, builders, developers, and groups on the program, and have received reports of multiple lots being sold under the program. 

Added Square Feet






Both commercial and residential square feet added increased in March from February

Home values decreased by 0.1% from February 2016 to March 2016. Annually, Urbana home values increased by 1.5%, compared to 2.1% in Champaign.



area update of the month:

BONEYARD CREEK



Through private investment, wayfinding, and programming, Boneyard creek is expected to become increasingly activated

Public Investment

Multiple departments within the City are working to bring additional visitors and development to the Boneyard Creek Improvement Project. Public Arts held a successful event for Boneyard Arts Festival on April 9th, drawing visitors of all ages to eat and stroll along the Boneyard. Public Works is working to implement wayfinding signage and additional design features to increase visibility of the Boneyard Creek Improvement Project. Economic Development is administering funding to enable private development alongside the improvement. Mayor Prussing and City Council are choosing a permanent name for the project.

Private Investment

Public investment in the Boneyard Creek Project has already spurred three private development projects. Silvercreek restaurant completed an outdoor deck renovation overlooking the Boneyard. Matt Cho has completed the purchase of 401 N Broadway, for a multi tenant year-round indoor market project. Griggs St Brewery is moving forward with the design process for a new brewery at 208 W Griggs Streets. These three new developments will join Best of Africa, currently located at 208 W Griggs Street, who completed extensive renovation in 2015. The private development projects will add additional economic activity and community vibrancy to the area.
