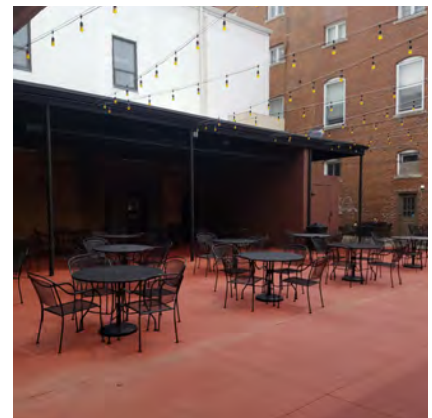

CUMTD MAINTENANCE FACILITY

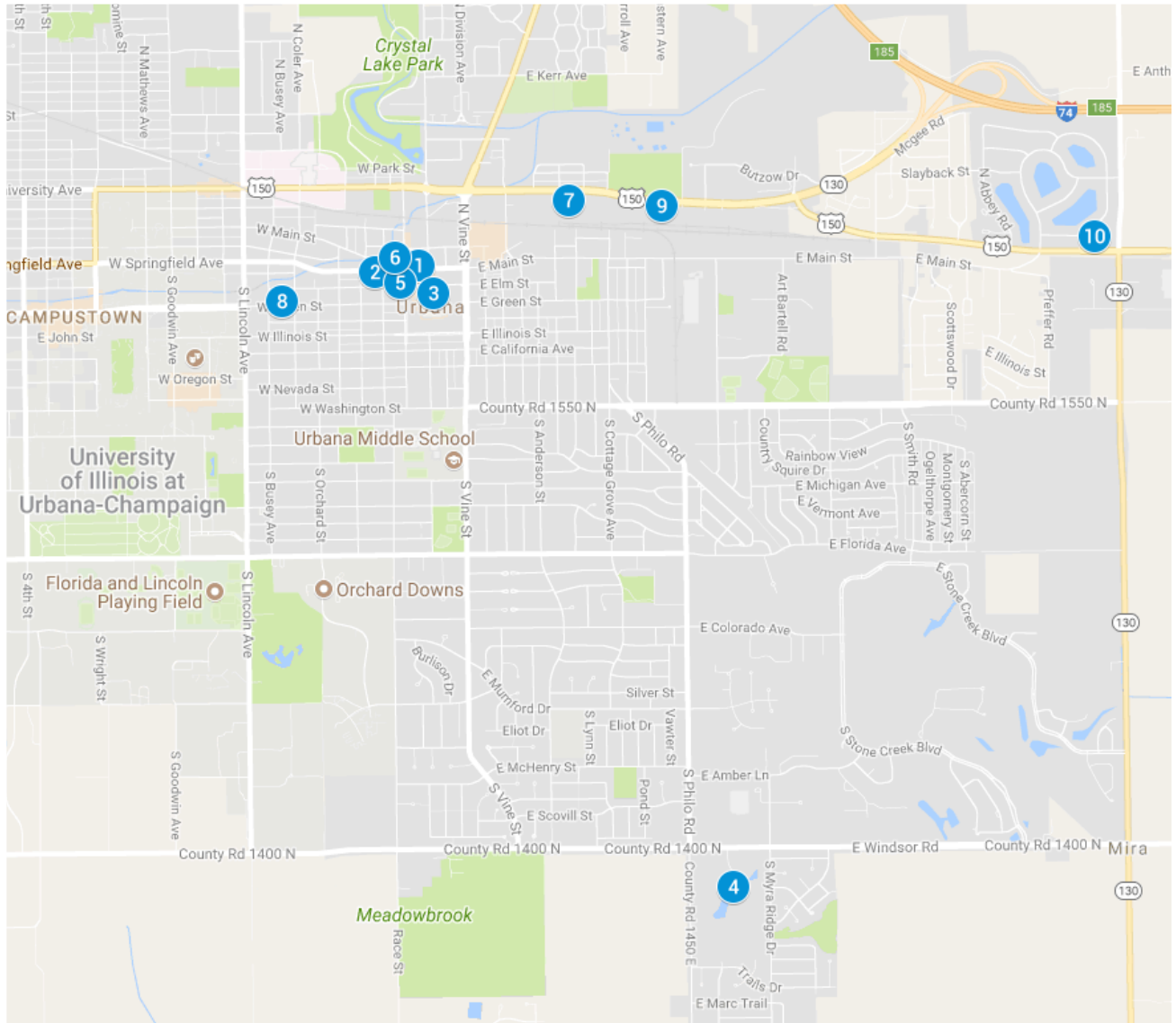
CUMTD has completed their \$8,255,950 expansion of their bus maintenance facility on 803 E University Avenue.

BUSINESS OUTREACH

In June, Economic Development met with Rick's Bakery, Gateway Shops, Pixo, Strawberry Fields, and SIPYARD to discuss business needs and opportunities for expansion. To-date, 22 projects, containing a total of 56 units, have applied to receive Think Urbana incentives.



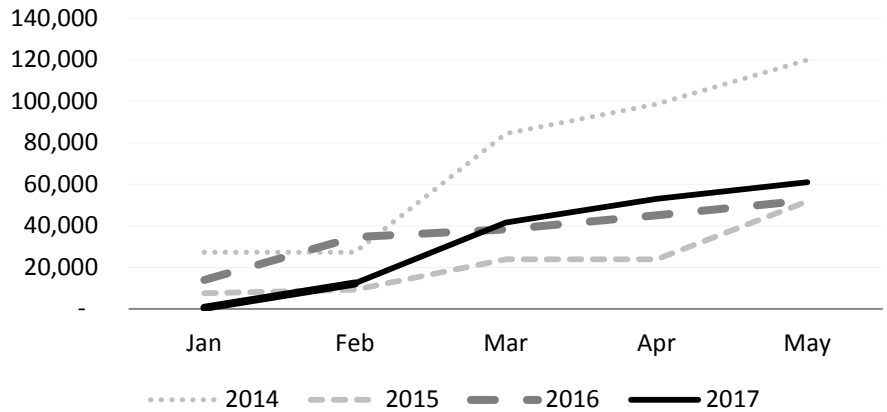
Total Square Feet Added Year-to-Date All Project Types

All New Construction & Additions



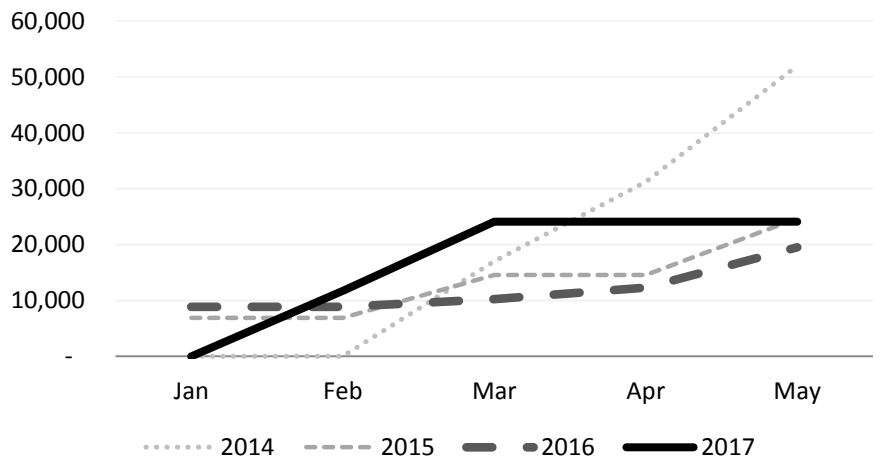

Single and Two Family New Construction



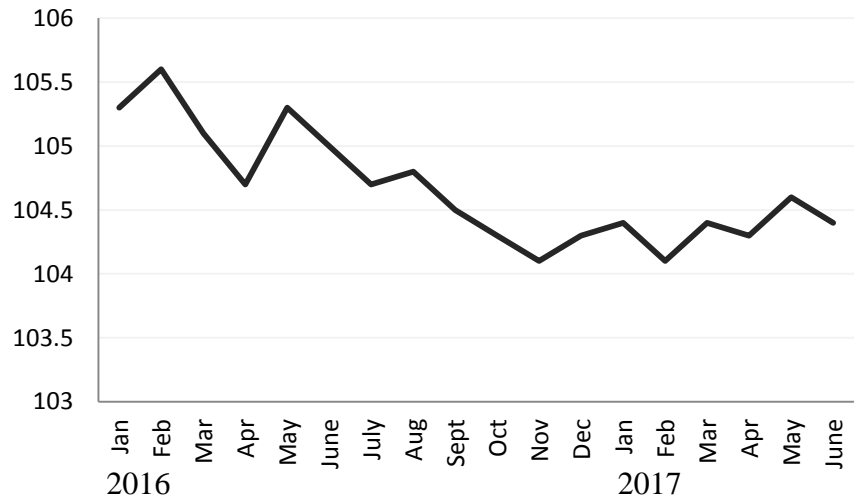

2016 - 2017 Illinois Flash Index



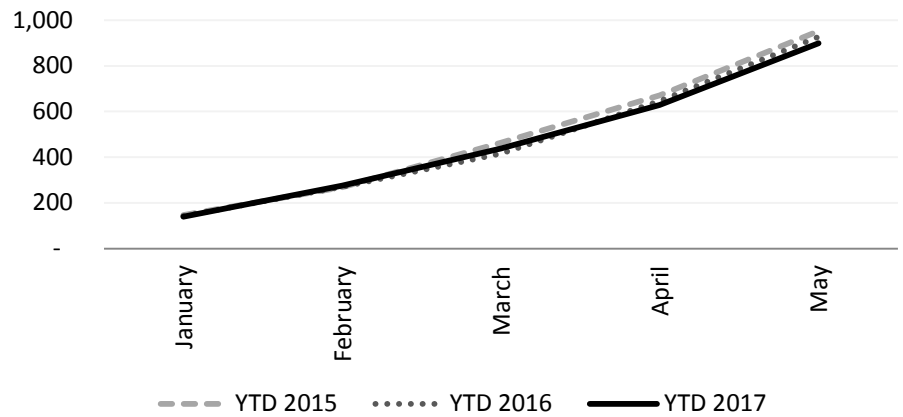
