Updates

SALT AND LIGHT

Salt and Light continues to move forward on their new second location on South Philo. The new facility will include a food co-op, thrift store, child-care, classrooms, a computer lab, and coffee shop. Salt and Light has remaining space they are looking to fill with tenants who compliment their mission.

SWEETCORN FESTIVAL

The 2017 Sweetcorn Festival put the focus on local talent and businesses. Sweetcorn drew 40,000 visitors to listen to over 30 local bands, drink beer from eight local bars, and visit over 80 food, merchandise, and information vendors. Local businesses like CU Adventures in Time and Space provided activities for all ages, and as always fresh sweetcorn was a hit with over 20,000 ears consumed.

BUSINESS OUTREACH

In August, Economic Development spoke with nine potential new businesses, and hosted a quarterly Business and Development Luncheon. The August Luncheon, sponsored by First Federal Savings bank and hosted in conjunction with the City of Champaign featured speakers from CUMTD, Willard Airport, and the MCORE Project and was emceed by Mayor Marlin. The event had 63 attendees from over 40 different organizations and businesses.

COFFEE AND COGS

After his success with Neutral Design Studio, Ricardo Pierre-Louis has branched out to start a new software and design consultancy firm *Coffee and Cogs*. The firm will offer mobile app development, data analysis, and digital branding service. As the seventh business to open in the Collider Coworking space, Ricardo will bring his knowledge and experience to the space.




Single-Family and Duplex Residential Square Feet Added

Year-To-Date Square Footage Added


All New Construction & Additions

Flash Index




Home Sales
