

URBANA CITY COUNCIL PUBLIC HEARING MINUTES Monday, December 9, 2019

The Urbana City Council held a public hearing on December 9, 2019 at 7:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers at the Urbana City Building, 400 S. Vine Street, Urbana, Illinois.

I. CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

With a quorum present, Mayor Marlin called the public hearing to order at 7:50 p.m. following a Cunningham Town Board meeting and other public hearings.

Mayor Marlin opened the hearing and stated the purpose of the hearing, which was to receive public input on the proposed property tax increase for the City of Urbana for 2019. She read from the notice as follows: The corporate and special purpose property taxes extended or abated for 2018 were \$7,876,330. The proposed corporate and special service property taxes to be levied for 2019 are \$10,325,152. This represents a 31.1% increase over the previous year. The property taxes extended for debt service and public building commission leases for 2018 were \$0. The estimated property taxes to be levied for debt service and public building commission leases for 2018 were \$0. The total property taxes extended or abated for 2018 were \$7,876,330. The setimated total property taxes to be levied for 2018 were \$7,876,330. The setimated total property taxes to be levied for 2019 are \$10,325,152. This represents a 31.1% increase over the previous year.

Mayor Marlin added that the 31% increase is based on the possibility that hospital properties are considered taxable and added to the tax rolls. The city intends to reduce the tax levy so that the current tax rates remain the same. Urbana homeowners should not see an increase in the city share of their property taxes unless they have seen their assessment increase. The city share of the total property tax bill is about 13%.

Mayor Marlin opened the public hearing. No one came forward.
