NU-MED

DOWNTOWN URBANA

Nifty Nook, a collaboration of 20 local makers, held a pop-up shop in the downtown over the holidays at 133 W. Main Street and were so pleased with the support received from the Urbana community that they have signed a lease to locate inside Enchantment Alley at 123 W. Main Street.

A ribbon cutting for Transcendence Broadcasting was held in late December to celebrate the company's relocation from Chicago to Urbana. Owners Gene & Nancy Koprowski are excited to set up shop in [co][lab] at 206 W. Main Street where they will be working on a new short video project for PBS celebrating the 80th anniversary of Looney Tunes Bugs Bunny.

Also in [co][lab], Mona Fang opened Karma Trade, a clothing swap service that operates at local events, in pop-up swap shops and online at https://www.karmatrade.shop/ for customers to trade in their clothes for points towards other used garments.

The Best of Africa's Food Store at 208 W. Griggs Street, owned by Lisette Mbaki and Memoire Budimbu, was nominated for a SBA National Small Business Award. Lisette is also providing an office for the Congolese Community of Champaign County above the store in Urbana.

Total Square Feet Added Yearto-Date All Project Types

A total of 245,911 square feet was added in Urbana from January through December 2019. This number represents higher square footage than was realized at the end of December 2013-2017, however substantially less than the 2018 calendar year. The difference is due to a large project that occurred in October of 2018 that increased housing square footage by over 200,000.


Single-Family and Duplex Residential Square Feet Added

In 2019 a total of 51,308 square feet was added for new construction of one and two family homes.

Even with removing The Retreat, which added over 200,000 square feet in 2018, 2019 was the lowest year on record for added square footage in single and multifamily residences.

Year-To-Date Square Footage Added





Flash Index

The Flash Index ended 2019 at a high of 105.6, where it had been in April though not seen previously since February 2016.


