SUBJECT: A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ACCEPTANCE OF A GRANT FOR

MARKET AT THE SQUARE (USDA-COVID Pandemic Relief and Protection

Program Grant 2022)

Introduction and Background

Urbana's Market at the Square was recently awarded a grant by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Pandemic Relief and Protection program to reimburse the Market for supplies used to respond to the COVID 19 pandemic. During the pandemic, Urbana's Market at the Square continued to operate with safety precautions in place. This grant will reimburse the market for supplies purchased to keep the market operating in a safe manner.

Discussion

While the grant funds have already been awarded to the City, it is necessary to adopt a resolution signifying their formal acceptance by the City Council and outlining the terms under which the funds were provided.

The grant is a \$11,099 award from USDA to reimburse the Market for supplies. This grant will be returned to the Market program budget for future needs.

Fiscal Impact

The grant is not anticipated to have any direct fiscal impact on the operation of Urbana's Market at the Square. All increases in revenues and expenditures related to this grant will be included in the fiscal year 2022/2023 budget brought before the City Council by the Finance Department.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ACCEPTANCE OF A GRANT FOR MARKET AT THE SQUARE

(U.S. Department of Agriculture – Pandemic Relief and Protection Program - 2022)

WHEREAS, the City of Urbana (the "City") is a home rule unit of local government pursuant to Article VII, Section 6, of the Illinois Constitution, 1970, and may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs, and the passage of this Resolution constitutes an exercise of the City's home rule powers and functions as granted in the Illinois Constitution, 1970; and

WHEREAS, the City operates a farmers market known as "Market at the Square" (the "Market") from early May through October; and

WHEREAS, the City has in one or more years accepted funds from various grants, in order to fund the Market; and

WHEREAS, USDA has offered a grant ("Grant") in the amount of \$11,099 to allow the City to be reimbursed for supplies to keep the market open and operating safely during the COVID 19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, the City is willing to accept the Grant on the terms and conditions provided by USDA.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council, of the City of Urbana, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. That the USDA Pandemic Relief and Protection Program grant shall be accepted by the City and that the City shall abide by the terms and conditions provided in the exhibit attached hereto and made a part hereof.

Section 2. That the Mayor of the City of Urbana, Illinois, be and the same is hereby authorized to undertake such additional steps as may be necessary for the City to receive the Grant and to arrange for the City's compliance with the terms and conditions contained in the exhibit appended hereto and made a part hereof without further actions by the City Council.
