Peggy Patten is a 40-year resident of the City of Urbana and is a retired University of Illinois Urbana – Champaign Early Care & Education (ECE) professional. During her three decade career she taught in the Child Development Laboratory, trained students in child development, founded and directed the Child Care Resource Service, and was a Research Information Specialist with the Early Childhood & Parenting Collaborative.
