b. Update on the Status of Complete Streets in the Subdivision Code and Manual of Practice – Marcus Ricci

Marcus Ricci gave an update on the complete streets policy and implementation.

Bill Brown asked if it as possible to change the initial statement in the subdivision code inclusions to give priority to the most vulnerable users. Or, at least recognize that pedestrians and bicyclists are the most vulnerable users and they should be given priority. Morgan White suggested saying they should be given added protection. Cynthia Hoyle said they should be provided safe accommodation for mobility.

Jeff Marino requested pedestrian scale lighting in residential areas be a priority.
