TASK FORCE INFORMATION:

The I.D.O.T. Traffic Stop Data Task Force was established by Urbana City Council Resolution NO. 2014-01-002.

The Task Force is charged with identifying and studying any racial disparities that may exist in local traffic stop data supplied annually to the City by the Illinois Department of Transportation (I.D.O.T.), and attempting to find the source and cause of any disparity. The Task Force is directed to examine multiple aspects of the traffic stop data, including race, driver age, residence, stop time, stop location, the reason for the stop, vehicle age, and any other information the Task Force finds to be useful. The Task Force will also look beyond traffic stop data to consider census and unemployment data, high school graduation rates, and incarceration statistics from the September 2013 study of the Champaign County justice system.

CITY OF URBANA MUNICIPAL CODE ORDINANCE VIOLATION SCHEDULE OF FEES

Sec. 1-10. - General penalty; continuing violations.

- (a) In all cases where the same offense is made punishable or is created by different clauses or sections of this Code, the prosecuting officer may elect under which to proceed, but not more than one (1) recovery shall be had against the same person for the same offense; provided that the revocation of a license or permit or fine imposed in an administrative hearing shall not be considered a recovery or penalty so as to bar any other penalty being enforced.
- (b) Whenever in this Code a minimum but not maximum fine or penalty is imposed, the court may in its discretion fine the offender any sum exceeding the minimum fine or penalty but not exceeding seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00).
- (c) Whenever in this Code the doing of any act or omission to do any act constitutes a violation of any section or provision of this Code, and the section or provision of this Code is listed in Section 1-18, any person who shall be convicted of any such violation shall be fined not less than the minimum fine set forth in Section 1-18 for that section or provision of this Code nor more than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) for each offense.
- (d) Whenever in this Code the doing of any act or the omission to do any act constitutes a violation of any section or provision of this Code, and the section or provision of this Code violated is not listed in Section 1-18 and there shall be no fine or penalty declared for such violation, any person who shall be convicted of any such violation shall be fined not less than one dollar (\$1.00) nor more than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) for each offense.
- (e) In case of amendment of any section of this Code containing the provisions for which a penalty is provided in another section, the penalty so provided in such other section shall relate to the section so amended or the amending section, whether re-enacted in the amendatory ordinance or not unless such penalty is specifically repealed therein.
- (f) Whenever a finding of guilty is entered by the court or a plea of guilty is entered by a defendant, the court may, in addition to a fine imposed, enter an order to pay restitution with restitution to be in an amount not to exceed actual out-of-pocket expenses or loss approximately caused by the conduct of the defendant. The court shall determine the amount and conditions of payments.
- (g) Whenever a finding of guilty is made by the court or a plea of guilty is entered by a defendant, the court may impose a sentence of supervision, and the incidents and conditions thereof, as defined in the Uniform Code of Corrections, as now or hereafter amended. The provisions as to employment, compensation, liability and any other provision contained in the Uniform Code of Corrections shall also apply.
- (h) A separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day during or on which a violation of this Code occurs or continues.
- (i) No provision of this Code designating the duties of any officer or employee shall be construed as to make such officer or employee liable for any fine or penalty provided in this Code for a failure to perform such duty, unless the intention of the council to impose such a fine or penalty on such officer or employee is specifically and clearly expressed in the section creating the duty.
- (j) Urbana Local Traffic Code fines.

- (1) Schedule of fines for certain specified offenses. The fines for certain specified violations of the local traffic code (Chapter 23 of this Code) shall be as established and amended from time to time by ordinance in a separate schedule of fines. The schedule of fines shall be in effect until amended by a duly enacted ordinance of the city. The schedule of fines shall be maintained by the office of the city clerk and shall be made available for public inspection and copying.
- (2) Pay-by-mail. Certain violations of the local traffic code may also be subject to Chapter 1, sections 1-17 and 1-18, "Settlement of violations prior to suit being filed; minimum fines."
- (3) Fines in judicial proceedings for parking violations. Regarding violations of any provision of Articles XII, XIII and XIV, sections 23-234 through 23-240 of the local traffic code (Chapter 23 of this Code), if the violator has taken no steps to challenge the applicable fines as set forth in the schedule of fines, through the administrative process established in sections 23-211 through 23-214, and the city elects to obtain judgment of this violation in the circuit court, a maximum fine of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) for each violation may be imposed.
- (4) In the event the city elects to initiate enforcement proceedings in the circuit court for any violation of the local traffic code (Chapter 23 of this code) the maximum fine for any violation shall be two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00), unless a higher maximum is set forth in the schedule of fines, in which case the maximum fine shall be the amount set forth in the schedule.
- (k) The fine for a violation of the Building Code, One- and Two-Family Dwelling Code, Electrical Code, Plumbing Code, Mechanical Code, Property Maintenance Code, Flood Hazard Areas Code, Mobile Home Parks and Mobile Homes Code, and Fire Prevention Code as adopted and amended by the City of Urbana shall be not less than one dollar (\$1.00) nor more than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00). Each day that a violation continues, after due notice has been served, shall be deemed a separate offense. No total fine in any individual case shall be less than three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for a first conviction of any of these codes, five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for a second conviction, and seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) for a third or subsequent conviction, irrespective of the number of days of the violation, unless the court finds that the violator is an indigent person.
- (I) In addition to any other remedy or penalty provided by this Code, the city attorney may apply to a court of competent jurisdiction to enjoin any violation of any provision of this Code, to compel compliance with the provisions of this Code, or to seek any other relief or remedy available at law or equity. Such application for relief may include a request for a temporary restraining order, temporary injunction, and permanent injunction.

If you want to contest the charge(s), you should appear at the place and time indicated on the front of this notice and you

should not pay the MINIMUM FINE.

FURTHER QUESTIONS

If you have questions regarding the charges filed against you or the amount of the MINIMUM FINE, then you should contact the Urbana Police Department at 217-384-2320. If you have questions regarding whether or not to pay the MINIMUM FINE or to contest the charges, you should seek the advice of an attorney.
