### Introduction

The following Urbana Public Arts Program Monthly Progress Report describes activities of the Public Arts Program for the Urbana Public Arts Commission. The report includes information regarding projects which are in process, recent requests and recommendations from the public, staff activities, and upcoming events.

### **Update on Current Projects**

- Gallery District Incentive Program—continued inquiries and business participation. Shared Space: Artist Co-op is the newest business participant, located at 123 W. Main Street.
- Urbana Arts Grants Program—2009 Projects underway. Final Reports are being submitted. Attached are reports from the Folk and Roots Music Festival, Lori Caterini, the IMC Film Fest, and Jennifer Monson. 2010 applicants have been informed of their award status. Agreements are being finalized with grantees.
- Urbana Sculpture Project—Staff provided an update at the Southeast Urbana Neighborhood Business meeting on the Philo Road Sculptures. Staff is finalizing the agreements and installation with the remaining three artists for the Philo Road and Green Street installations.
- Fundraising—Staff is working with the City Legal Division to clarify the process by which the Commission can fund raise. Additional information is provided in the staff memo enclosed in the packet.
- City Building Exhibit Space—The Artist of the Corridor Spring 2010 exhibit was installed. The work will be on display for the quarter (March May). - UPTV Arts Program—the subcommittee and staff
- Program Grants—staff is working on an application for the Illinois Arts Council Program Grant. The deadline is April 20, 2010. The City's application to the National Endowment for the Arts Access to Artistic Excellence grant was not selected for funding this year.

## Urbana Hosts Community Dialogue on Art, Labor, and Economics

The City of Urbana Public Arts Program invites public participation in a community dialogue entitled "Art Work: a National Conversation on Art, Labor, and Economics". On May 1, 2010, from 3:30 – 5:00PM, join artists Brett Bloom and Salem Collo-Jullin of Temporary Services and other guests to discuss the topic. The discussion will take place in the Urbana Free Library Lewis Auditorium, at 210 West Green Street in Urbana.

In January 2010, artist collective Temporary Services launched a 40 page newspaper about the state of art in the economic environment.
