SUBJECT: Urbana Arts Grants Online Management System

Background

Launched in 2009 to support projects in the arts occurring in Urbana, the Urbana Arts Grants program makes funding available to artists, artist teams, organizations, businesses, and festival presenters for eligible projects that enrich the lives of residents and visitors. In its first four cycles, the program has supported 85 projects in a variety of arts disciplines. Since its inception, the Urbana Arts Grants program has employed a paper-based application form. Though a paper-based form will always be available to make the program as accessible as possible, an online system to manage the many applications and project materials received would benefit applicants, grant recipients, and the administrator of the program. As the Program continues to grow, switching to an online system would simplify the process for everyone involved.

Discussion

In 2012, the Urbana Public Arts Program and the Public Arts Commission Urbana Arts Grant Subcommittee developed a survey to issue to past and present grant applicants and recipients (Exhibit A.) The goal of the survey was to gather ideas to improve the granting process. Twenty-three responses to the survey were received with a variety of answers. When asked how they would improve the application process, many survey takers suggested an online-based application form (Exhibit B.)

Staff sent out a query to the Public Art Network (PAN), an e-mail listserv of public artists and administrators, to learn what online grants management services other programs use and could recommend (Exhibit C.) The majority of responses recommended Westaf Cafe, with other recommendations including Slideroom, Submittable, PublicArtist and custom-built systems. These services, and other services found by staff, were investigated for potential use by the Urbana Public Arts Program.

Detailed research was conducted into 11 different online grants management services, with results compiled in the attached table, Online Grants Management Service Comparisons (Exhibit D.) The following criteria were taken into consideration:

- Ability to create entry fields (for the application form)
- Ability to accept text submissions
- Ability to accept audio submissions
- Ability to accept image submissions
- Ability to accept video submissions
- Customizable appearance to utilize Urbana Arts Grants branding
- How the users would access the application (via websites, links, portals, etc.)
- A budget of approximately \$1,000 per year
- The service's review/jury capabilities
- The ability to export and organize data

After initial research, the services GO: Grants Online, Slideroom, PublicArtist, Foundant, Google Forms, EntryThingy, and Gravity Forms were eliminated from consideration due to high cost, inability to meet the Urbana Public Arts Program's needs, or other incompatibilities. The services GO.5, Westaf Café, Submittable, and ReviewRoom were examined further.

GO.5 (http://www.gograntsonline.org/overview/go_5/) allows text, audio, image, and video submissions. It is customizable, allows staff to use Urbana Public Arts Program branding, and allows users access to the application via a separate website. It also allows staff to create reports and export data. Staff attended an online demonstration of the service and found that while the service was simple to use, it cost \$2,500 per year. Staff decided that GO.5, while able to suit all the program's needs, was too expensive and eliminated it from consideration.

Westaf Café (<https://www.callforentry.org/>) is slightly customizable, and allows administrators to export data. Users would access the application via the Café website, where they must have an account. It allows text and image submissions, while audio and video submissions are \$3 per entry. Café charges a one-time set up fee of \$250 and each call for entry is \$450. Staff attended an online demonstration of the service, and learned that Café heavily caters to public art calls. While the Urbana Public Arts Program might use the service for public art calls, the primary purpose of identifying a management system was for the Urbana Arts Grants, so Café was eliminated from consideration.

Submittable (<http://www.submittable.com/>) has the ability to accept text, image, audio, and video files. Users could access the application via a link on the Urbana Public Arts Program website. Staff created a test account for the service, and learned that it does not allow entry fields for applications. Lacking this capability, coupled with \$100 monthly cost and several spelling and grammar errors on the Submittable website led staff to determine that Submittable was not suitable for the program's needs.

ReviewRoom (<http://myreviewroom.com/>) is a web-based service that allows administrators to accept and manage applications and submissions, and review them online. It is very customizable and allows users to submit a variety of text, image, audio, and video files. Users would access the application via a separate website created by staff. Staff created a test account

with ReviewRoom and found the administrative process of creating and managing applications to be intuitive and simple to use. Staff also created test forms with ReviewRoom (Exhibit E) and discovered that the application was easy to understand and straightforward. The data received from the test submissions was easily exported into Excel spreadsheets and PDF documents. Additionally, staff found ReviewRoom's technical support to be prompt and helpful.

Use of ReviewRoom at the Pro level, which provides the necessary capability for the program, costs \$695 a year. Due to an unfinished 2011 Urbana Arts Grant project, the Public Arts Commission is able to fund the use of ReviewRoom for a year without impacting funding available for 2013 grant projects. The capabilities provide by the service, including producing spreadsheets of application information, the ability for applicants to directly load work samples, and automatic communication with applicants, are estimated to save 40 hours of staff time spent on administering Urbana Arts Grants. The staff salary for 40 hours is more than the yearly cost of ReviewRoom.

For all of these reasons, staff determined that of the systems researched ReviewRoom is the most suitable service for the Urbana Public Arts Program. It suits all of the Program's needs, and staff learned first-hand that the service is simple to operate for both administrators and applicants.

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Commission approve ReviewRoom as the Urbana Public Arts Program's online grant management service.

We have used both CAFÉ and Slideroom. We will never use CAFÉ again. Slideroom is great for ease of use by everyone with good tech support. We negotiate a fee in advance based on estimated number of applicants. Slideroom is more expensive than CAFÉ, but since it is so much easier to use, it requires less staff time walking hysterical artists through the application process.

I am in the process of using CaFE right now for the Florida Public Art Year in Review. I have found it to be pretty easy, though obtaining the images for a slide show at the end takes a few days through the mail. My only suggestion is to be sure that all of your jurors and/or reviewers are computer savvy. I assumed they were and boy, was I wrong, one person will not use a computer!

I'm a member of ArtsUSA because I want to support the arts and never thought about a need for software. However, my company has a product like this. Anyone have a submission process that they would be willing to share and I'll see if my system could handle? If so, I could see about making this available to all Arts USA members in some way as a way to support this great cause.

If you're willing to share your submission process, let me know!

At 4Culture (based in Seattle) we have developed our own application system to support our Public Art section and our 13 funding programs. However, we do try to keep up on what else is out there. We found this recently, "A Consumer's Guide to Grants Management Software" --- which compares 20 grants management software products, describing the core strengths and weaknesses of each system, showing how they stack up against each other across a set of 17 different criteria, and detailing how each system addresses more than 125 different criteria. is a system very easy to use for artists.

The Port of Portland is using Café for a second time with good results. Our first project using the system was a call for artists to develop work for our new HQ. The budget was 1.3 million total. The current project is an RFQ for a tunnel art project; budget is \$500,000. So far, no trouble. Many professional artists are already registered on Café (they have over 90,000 members) so submitting is simplified. I have also registered on the system as an artist and I can tell you first hand, the application process is pretty simple.

There may be other systems that also work well but our experience with Café has been fine.

The Missouri Arts Council uses WESTAF's Culturegrants online system. The new one has expanded capability for support material. MAC is currently working with the "basic" version and will upgrade to the new and improved version next year. You might be able to get a break if you use both Culturegrants and CAFÉ. Doesn't hurt to ask. Good luck! Keiko

We have a new service which would be great for you! It's called PublicArtist.org. We designed it so that creating calls is easy for administrators and applying is easy for artists.

Things are going well with the site, which is currently in beta mode (this means that we are not charging for the full range of services to artists and

administrators). Soon, we will go fully live and begin charging. Our fee structure can be found on this page:

We will ALWAYS allow free call postings and applications. However, paid memberships allow for many time-saving features which you probably wouldn't want to be without. Specifically, online judging and an artist roster for administrators, as well as an image portfolio and document management system for artists.

The UrbanArt Commission in Memphis has a purpose built system that works like a dream.

I have to agree about PublicArtist.org. Yes, it takes time to set up your images, bio, etc. but once it's done, it's so simple to get together a proposal/submission. I was on there again last week, took me all of 10 minutes max to put together what I needed and download it ready to burn on a cd.

Eventually I know there will be more opportunities that you can apply for right from the site, looking forward to that!

We have been working with Foundant for approx. 1 year. The support staff is more than helpful with phone training sessions, etc. The program is easy to use and allows the user to format forms, applications, etc. tailored to the administrator and applicant's needs. There are many more resources, tools, etc. included.

Flux Projects has used CaFE twice now, and we are extremely pleased with it and plan to use again. They have made some changes to their uploads of images and media to make it easier. We have also used from the applicant side, and I found it very simple.

We have had a great experience using www.submittable.com for open calls.

As a footnote, anything that would cost an artist \$\$\$ to apply for public art projects is NOT of interest to me and a lot of my contemporaries. Too many calls are already free to apply for somewhere.

The New Mexico Arts Art in Public Places Program was used Café for about 4 ½ years now. We have been very happy with it.
