The meeting was called to order by Chief Adair at 5:35 p.m.

Todd Peck from the Urbana Park District announced that he will be attending the UCAP meetings on a regular basis on behalf of the Park District. He also distributed flyers for the dedication of the Labyrinth located at Crystal Lake Park to be held Friday, May 21, 2004 and for the Labyrinth Conference to be held May 22, 2004.

Bob Grewe from Urbana Community Development discussed the Spring Neighborhood Cleanup to be held May 8, 2004. He asked that committee members refer to their recent newsletter for details. He also reported that block grant money has been budgeted for improvements to Sunset Drive and for sidewalk improvements on Harvey Street.

Jerry Moreland asked that UCAP Chairman John Cooper sign a letter of support, on behalf of the UCAP committee, supporting the purchase and distribution of garbage cans throughout the neighborhood by the UTEL (United To Eliminate Litter) committee. He also brought a map showing the possible locations of the cans. John Cooper made a motion to sign the letter of support and Leonard Christmon seconded the motion. The motion passed. The letter was then signed by Chairman Cooper.

James Hayes reported that he attended Robin Hall's retirement party on April 13, 2004. He also reported that the park at Beslin and Goodwin has been cleaned up, mowed and

planted with flowers by the City. He stated that there are plans for a gas station to be built at Lincoln and Bradley and plans for condos and another gas station to be built on Lincoln Avenue in the future. He also stated that the City has received the tax money from Provena but do not plan to use the money until appeals by Provena are completed.

Chief Adair distributed Duck Race entry forms to committee members for the Great C-U Duck Race to be held May 1, 2004. The proceeds will benefit the Don Moyer Boys & Girls Club. He also reported that the recent murder in Urbana had been solved and that he will be attending a neighborhood meeting at Woodstone Apartments on April 19, 2004, where the incident occurred, to talk to residents about concerns they have and ways to solve some of the outbreaks of crime in that area. He also reported that budget talks for Fiscal Year 2004/05 are continuing and should be completed in May 2004.
