## UCAP ADVISORY COMMITTEE MINUTES King School Library January 20, 2005

Chief Eddie Adair called the meeting to order at 5:33 p.m.

Mayor Satterthwaite distributed copies of a summary of city projects in the King Park and Crystal Lake Park neighborhoods from 1993- 2005. The list included the cost of each project and reflected an overall total of \$2,759,805. He also discussed the downtown Urbana redevelopment projects that will be started soon and reported that funding for the demolition of Lakeside Terrace had been approved. The Mayor suggested that the candidate running for City Council for Ward 3, Robert Lewis, be invited to upcoming UCAP meetings in order to make him aware of concerns and possible suggestions residents may have for the neighborhood in the future. Mayor Satterthwaite then addressed questions from those in attendance.

Mayoral candidate Laurel Prussing was asked to attend the meeting by Samuel Johnson to give a brief summary of her experience and qualifications. Following her summary, she distributed copies of a letter written by Phyllis Clark in her support.

James Hayes encouraged those in attendance to familiarize themselves with all three mayoral candidates, Tod Satterthwaite, Laurel Prussing and Shirley Hursey as well as the Ward 3 candidate Robert Lewis. He stated that there will be forums held in the coming weeks to give the residents of Urbana an opportunity to hear the candidate's views and goals for the City of Urbana for the next four years.

Chief Adair reported on a recent outbreak of car burglaries in the campus area and in southeast Urbana. The Chief reported that suspects in these burglaries had been arrested and some of the stolen property had been recovered. Chief Adair also reported that crime in the Woodstone Apartment area is down. Committee members discussed neighborhood concerns. Chief Adair and Mayor Satterthwaite addressed their concerns/questions. Discussion followed.

Chief Adair announced that the next UCAP meeting will be held on February 17, 2005 in the King School Library. The March 17, 2005 meeting, however, will be held at the Urbana Police Department since King School will not be available for the meeting due to parent-teacher conferences.

Meeting was adjourned at 6:55 p.m.
