

UNITED STATES PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICE FOOD SERVICE SANITATION ORDINANCE
AND CODE WHICH FOLLOWS 1962 RECOMMENDATIONS, AND AS AMENDED,
ADOPTED AS THE ORDINANCE AND CODE OF THE CITY OF URBANA, ILLINOIS

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois that the United States Public Health Service Food Service Sanitation Ordinance and Code which follows 1962 recommendations, and as amended, is hereby adopted as the ordinance and code of the City of Urbana, Illinois.

Such Ordinance and Code is also entitled An Ordinance defining food, potentially hazardous food, adulterated, misbranded, food-service establishment, temporary food-service establishment, health authority, utensils, equipment, etc.; providing for the sale of only unadulterated, wholesome, properly branded food; regulating the sources of food; establishing sanitation standards for food, food protection, food-service personnel, food-service operations, food equipment and utensils, sanitary facilities and controls, and other facilities; requiring permits for the operation of food-service establishments; regulating the inspection (grading, regrading, and placarding)²⁵ of such establishments; providing for the examination and condemnation of food; and providing for the enforcement of this ordinance, and the fixing of penalties.

This ordinance and code is hereby adopted to be in effect ten days after the adoption approval and publication of the adoptive ordinance. All prior ordinances and provision in conflict with the adopted ordinance and code herewith are hereby repealed.

Any person who shall violate any provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of misdemeanor and upon conviction of such violation shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$200.00.
