

AN ORDINANCE  
AMENDING THE URBANA LOCAL TRAFFIC ORDINANCE  
WITH RESPECT TO PARKING FOR HANDICAPPED PERSONS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF  
URBANA, ILLINOIS, as follows:

Section 1. That Ordinance No. 7778-9 is repealed in its entirety upon the taking effect of this Ordinance and all regulations heretofore promulgated under authority of the former Urbana Parking Commission relating to handicapped parking are hereby rescinded.

Section 2. That Article XII, entitled "Stopping, Standing or Parking Prohibited in Specified Places", of the Urbana Local Traffic Ordinance, as amended, be and the same is further amended to add a new section to be numbered as Section 12-9, and entitled "Special Provisions for Parking by Handicapped Persons", which shall provide as follows:

A. No person who is not handicapped shall park any vehicle in any parking space which has been designated for a handicapped or disabled person. A vehicle which is driven by, or carries as a passenger, a person who is handicapped within the meaning of subsection (B) below may be parked in a parking place designated for a handicapped or disabled person. If a vehicle is displaying current state registration plates for handicapped persons, or state authorized sticker issued for handicapped persons, or the City of Urbana sticker issued hereunder, such vehicle shall be deemed prima facie to be eligible to use such space.

B. For the purpose of this section, a handicapped person shall include every natural person whose permanent or temporary condition causes that person to walk with difficulty or insecurity.

C. Any person who has a handicap within the meaning of subsection (B) above, may procure a certificate from the Comptroller as provided for herein.

D. The Comptroller shall issue either of the following certificates upon the applicant's request. Satisfactory proof of the applicant's medical condition may be required prior to issuance of the certificates at the discretion of the Comptroller.

1) Temporary Handicap Certificate. A person whose temporary medical condition which causes the handicap can be reasonably expected to cease or become alleviated to a degree that the handicap no longer exists within six (6) months of the date of application for the Temporary Handicap Certificate.

2) Permanent Handicap Certificate. A person whose permanent medical condition which causes the handicap may reasonably be expected to continue throughout such person's lifetime.

E. A Temporary Handicap Certificate shall expire six (6) months after issuance. Such certificate may be renewed any number of times under the same terms and conditions as are required for the issuance for the first such certificate.

F. A Permanent Handicap Certificate shall be valid for the lifetime of the applicant, but is not transferable. Such certificate may be replaced any number of times.

G. Satisfactory proof of medical condition shall be only a written statement signed by a physician or osteopath stating that such person is either permanently or temporarily handicapped, and that such medical condition results in such person being able to walk only with difficulty or insecurity. Such written statement must be dated not earlier than thirty (30) days prior to the application for such certificate.

Section 3. That Section 14-8, entitled "Parking on Private Property", of Article XIV, entitled "Stopping, Standing or Parking Restricted or Prohibited on Certain Streets", of the Urbana Local Traffic Ordinance, as amended, be and the same is hereby further amended to provide as follows:

A. It shall be unlawful to park any motor vehicle on private property without the consent of the owner of the private property.

B. Any person who is not handicapped, and who parks a motor vehicle in a parking space on private property designated for handicapped or disabled persons, shall be deemed to have parked without the permission of the owner of the private property. Such permission, however, shall be presumed as to a vehicle, which is driven by, or carries as a passenger, a person who is handicapped within the meaning of Section 12-9(B), if the certificate provided for by state law or by this ordinance or current state registration plates for handicapped persons is displayed on such vehicle.

Section 4. That Section 14-11, entitled "Towing of Illegally Parked Vehicles", of Article XIV, entitled "Stopping, Standing or Parking Restricted or Prohibited on Certain Streets", of the Urbana Local Traffic Ordinance, as amended, be and the same is hereby further amended to provide as follows:

Any vehicle found to be in violation of any of the provisions of the above Sections 12-1, 12-2, 12-8, 14-7 and 14-8(a) may be ordered to be towed away and impounded at the expense of the owner (regardless of whether "tow away" signs are erected or not). Additionally, any vehicle which is found to be illegally parked in an area designated "tow away zone" may be towed away and impounded at the expense of the owner, provided such areas have been posted with "tow away" signs.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication in accordance with the terms of Section 1-2-4 of the Illinois Municipal Code.

This Ordinance is hereby passed by the affirmative vote, the "ayes" and "nays" being called, of a majority of the members of the Council of the City of Urbana, Illinois, at a regular meeting of said Council on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of May 1980.

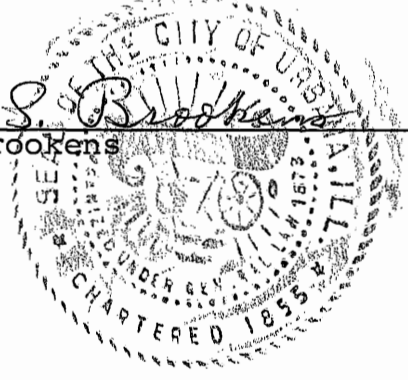

B. For the purpose of this sec-  
tion, a handicapped person shall  
include every natural person whose  
permanent or temporary condition  
causes that person to walk with  
difficulty or insecurity.

C. Any person who has a handi-  
cap within the meaning of subsec-  
tion (B) above, may procure a cer-  
tificate from the Comptroller as  
provided for herein.

D. The Comptroller shall issue  
either of the following certificates  
upon the applicant's request. Satis-  
factory proof of the applicant's  
medical condition may be required  
prior to issuance of the certificates  
at the discretion of the Comptrol-  
ler.

1) Temporary Handicap Certifi-  
cate. A person whose temporary  
medical condition which causes  
the handicap can be reasonably  
expected to cease or become  
alleviated to a degree that the  
handicap no longer exists within  
six (6) months of the date of ap-  
plication for the Temporary Handi-  
cap Certificate.

2) Permanent Handicap Certifi-  
cate. A person whose permanent  
medical condition which causes  
the handicap may reasonably be  
expected to continue throughout  
such person's lifetime.

E. A Temporary Handicap Cer-  
tificate shall expire six (6) months  
after issuance. Such certificate  
may be renewed any number of  
times under the same terms and  
conditions as are required for the  
issuance for the first such certi-  
ficate.

F. A Permanent Handicap Cer-  
tificate shall be valid for the
